



## **Tuxedo Park Library**

### **3D Printing Policy**

Tuxedo Park Library strives to offer community access to new and emerging technologies to inspire creativity and learning. This policy establishes guidelines for the public use of the Library's 3D printer. The 3D printer can be used to make three dimensional objects with a design that is uploaded from a digital computer file. This service is not intended for production or manufacturing, and the Library reserves the right to refuse to print large numbers of identical objects. The use of the printer requires a valid Tuxedo Park Library card.

The 3D printer may be used only for lawful practices. Library users may not create material that is:

- Prohibited by local, state or federal law
- Unsafe, harmful, dangerous or poses a threat to the well-being of others, including weapons
- Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the library environment
- Regulated or requires a license to use or carry
- In violation of another's intellectual property rights. By submitting content, the patron agrees to assume all responsibility for and shall hold the Library harmless in all matters related to patented, trademarked or copyrighted materials.

Additionally, the Library reserves the right to deny any 3D print request. The Library is not responsible for any damage, loss or security of data arising from the use of its computers or network, nor for the functionality or quality of the content produced on the 3D printer.
