Proposed 2023 Budget

<u>Income</u>

On Tuesday, November 8, 2022 there will be a budget proposition on the ballot at the General Election. For next year, the Board of Trustees of the Tuxedo Park Library is requesting an increase of \$17,768 or 3.05% over last year's budget, an increase of a penny a day for each Tuxedo resident.

The proposed budget reflects our ongoing commitment to maintaining a high level of library service to the residents of Tuxedo while controlling costs.




